






FY24 Projections: 1,050 Arrivals



WELCOME CORPS

FIRST YEAR:

15,000 Americans applied.

100 sponsor groups in 32 states have now welcomed refugees.

Can be matched with refugees they don't know or to apply to sponsor refugees they know.

CSI Refugee Programs is becoming an official field office of U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants (USCRI).


USCRI since 1980 has supported Twin Falls with refugee travel coordination, funding, policy direction, and technical support.

College of Southern Idaho supports the move. It will strengthen capacity to serve clients, support staff, and streamline reporting.






Arrival Stats

COMPOSITION CASE

Matching Grant Stats 10/1/2023 to 2/7/2024

- 35 Cases
- 69 Clients
- Clients with Service Plan 54%
- 11 Clients with limited English
- 12 ORR deemed Employable Clients

The Matching Grant program helps refugees and other ORR-eligible populations overcome barriers and quickly find jobs. The intent is for refugees to become economically self-sufficient through employment within 240 days and without accessing cash assistance programs.

The program is a public/ private partnership enabling communities to become directly involved in supporting refugees through donations, volunteer support, and mentorship.



FLEC Collaboration

This partnership supports IRC clients on their pathway to self-suffiency



- Cultural Orientation Classes held here
- Digital Literacy Classes held
- All clients are bus trained to FLEC in collaboration with Job Readiness Training
- Youth tutoring available
- Staff utilize for client service meetings

Intensive Case Management (ICM)

- 65 Individual Cases
- 22 Pending enrollments that are waiting for assessment on the waitlist
- Largest categories of enrollment: Mental or Psychological challenges, Medical or Physical Challenges, single parent household, and linkage to benefits.

Achievements:

Under the Preferred Communities department, the newest addition of a mental health team of LMSW. Currently available to serve any client who falls under ORR eligibility and is offering individual, family, and group therapy and do not have a waiting list at this time.

WHAT IS PREFERRED COMMUNITIES (PC)?

Preferred Communities is a program that houses the Intensive Case Management (ICM) Program, as well as a Mental Health Department at the IRC in Boise. With a culturally sensitive and client centered approach to therapy and case management, clients will be able to receive care from highly trained staff as they work towards a path to stability and self-sufficiency.

WHO ARE WE SERVING?

Clients eligible for Preferred Communities have to meet the following requirements:

- Not a U.S. citizen.
- Have to have refugee, asylee, humanitarian parolee, or SIV status.
- Meet a certain level of vulnerability and need.

Insurance for clients is not required. Once referred to PC, clients will have an assessment to see if PC services are the right fit.

SERVICES OFFERED

- Interpreted groups, 1:1, and Family therapy
- Pro-Bono services
- No denial based on insurance
- Intensive case management

- Trauma-informed modalities that include: CBT, Somatic Therapy, DBT, Art and Play therapy
- Culturally appropriate and interpreted services in both case management and clinical services.
