Language Access Requirements:

- <u>U.S. law</u> requires government agencies or organizations that receive federal funds to provide interpretation services to people seeking services.
- Visit <u>LEP.gov</u> for resources and information to help expand and improve language assistance services for individuals with limited English proficiency, in compliance with federal law.
- The Idaho Department of Transportation has a <u>Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Language</u>
 Assistance Plan. The requirements in this plan also apply to county DMVs.
